• SRS (Singapore Registry of Ships) Ship Owner of the Year Award

This is awarded to the outstanding owner of quality Singapore-registered ships.

Bunker Award

The Bunker Award recognises the outstanding bunker supplier or bunker craft operator that has demonstrated commitment to quality standards, quantity assurances and customer satisfaction, in line with the objective of promoting Singapore as the preferred bunkering hub.



• Outstanding Maritime R&D and Technology Award

It is awarded to the company or research institution in Singapore that has demonstrated outstanding innovation in the research, development or test-bedding of technology for the maritime industry.

Maritime Service Provider Award

It is granted to the maritime service provider that has demonstrated exceptional professional performance and contribution to Singapore's maritime industry.

• Excellence in Manpower Training & Development Award

It is awarded to the organisation that has contributed to the growth and development of Singapore's maritime manpower by demonstrating their commitment towards supporting employment and training efforts.

International Maritime Centre (Corporate) Award

This is awarded to the company that has contributed significantly towards the development of Singapore as an International Maritime Centre.

International shipping accounts for 2-3%. of global GHG emissions – a number that will only increase in line with expected growth in global trade if no actions are taken. Shipping is a hard-to-abate sector and the solution involves the entire maritime value chain from fuel production via ports to the ships. Therefore, it requires international collaboration amongst states, companies and non-state actors as well as across the value chain to reach the international climate goals set in the Paris Agreement and in the International Maritime Organisation's initial GHG strategy.

The overall challenge is to make different parts of the value chain across sectors commit, cooperate and deliver at the same time to prove that emission-free shipping has the potential to be a practicable and viable choice. Therefore, it is crucial to ensure the right framework for innovation across the entire value chain to support the development of new energy systems and technologies for decarbonising shipping. Furthermore, international collaboration across the maritime value chain is key to ensure the development of zero-emission shipping, and zero-emission shipping is a must-win battle in our collective effort to overcome climate change.

On 22 April 2021, leading maritime players are invited to pinpoint their views as Singapore and Denmark seek to unfold potentials for increased international public-private collaboration towards emission-free shipping.
